Josh Ulrich reported for the month...Hung up Christmas decorations on Main Street and on 116. The outlets aren't working on some of the poles. Put up Christmas tree in front of the Legion. Cleared the sump drain on Main Street a few times as it flooded. Plowed snow and spread salt two times. Picked up brush and leaves. Swept leaves out of the drains on Main Street. The white truck was washed and serviced. Finished painting the bed of the white truck. The white truck had oil and filters changed. Drained and replaced antifreeze in the leaf vac. Rearranged the logs at the dump from Trost. Trust is done and planted 5 trees around town. Flushed hydrant by the bank. The back-hoe was washed. Ordered new pump for fluoride. Julie called and locates in Jensen Estates. Repainted and cleaned salt spreader. Picked up and disposed of 3 road kills. Cleaned up

downed tree limb at Legion Lake. Fixed the aerator compressor for legion lake. Changed chlorine pump at the well station. Spread bacteria in sewers throughout town. Siren is still not working, sent in the receiver into be repaired or replaced.

Good Sam's Proposal: Roadway Construction Improvements and Water service line Construction Improvements has estimated total cost of \$43,869.05 per Poundstone Engineering & Surveying Inc. The total cost is broken down two ways: Roadway construction of \$10,807.00 and Water Service line construction of \$27,340.00 plus engineering fees of \$5,722.05. Good Sam would be

liable for getting the work done and paid for as properties sell. The rezoning of the property from commercial to residential is done afterwards. This is a standard process to move forward. It was mentioned, we should get contractors to look at the roads to gather numbers to see if Good Sam's' numbers are accurate or not and even to see the cost of resurfacing. The proposal is not supposed to cost the village anything. Good Sam would cut a check to the village for the \$10,807.00 to use how the village sees fit.
